Class will meet twice a month for four months, allowing you to approach the quilt in an organized way and yet have some flexibility of

working on your own. You Will have some homework in this class but will wind up with a stunning quilt!

A new twist on bargello quilts - this one using bargello pinwheels. Can be made square (60x60") or rectangular (60x75 or 60x90"). Ten fabrics in two color ways are used to make this dynamic quilt.

KUSPUK

Must have garment sewing experience.

Susan is originally from Nome and started making Kuspuks about 10 years ago. She has learned from many people, including Dora Andrew-Ihrke who previously taught Qaspeq (Kuspuks) making at the Quilt Tree. To help ensure that your Kuspuks will be a good fit she'll have prototype Kuspuks for trying on and patterns to use/copy. She will also teach traditional ways of measuring that she learned from Dora. These can be used as sizing guidelines for making future Kuspuks for your friends and family. You will come away from this class with a drop shoulder Kuspuks and a pattern of your size.

VARIATIONS ON ONE BLOCK WONDER

Word is out! Wool applique is becoming one of the fastest growing hand-sewing methods. It is easy; it is beautiful; it can be portable depending on your piece; and the wool and sewing accessories are very accessible. It can even become a relaxing way to watch television. No previous experience is required for this class. Choose your own pattern. (The class sample is Marcia's Flowers from Through the Needle's Eye.) Small pieces are suggested for your first venture, such as a wall hanging, a penny rug, or a pillow. Instant gratification is common. Be ready to become addicted.

PEAKS AND VALLEYS

Many have requested another Double Wedding so now is the time. This one uses Judy Niemeyer's foundation-piecing pattern. You can make yours with scalloped borders or, like the sample, add setting triangles and focal fabric for a larger quilt. The pattern is for a small queen size but can be made larger with purchase of additional foundation papers. No prior foundation piecing skills required, Pam will teach that in class along with curved piecing instruction. The DWR template set by Creative Grids is highly recommended.

QUILT TREE CLASS LEVELS

BEGINNER I – You must know how to sew on your machine. These classes will include instruction in basic rotary cutting and piecing.

BEGINNER II - You must already have basic piecing and rotary cutting skills. These classes will expand your skills or give special tips.

INTERMEDIATE – You are experienced in piecing and rotary skills. These classes are a little faster paced and often tackle more difficult patterns.

QUILT CLASS SUPPLIES

Supplies are needed for almost all classes. If a pattern, book, notion or fabric is necessary to make the quilt top or bag, it is a required purchase. The class fee covers instruction *only*. You are responsible for picking up your supply list and coming to class prepared.

The Quilt Tree / Yarn Branch cannot guarantee we will have specialty items the night of a particular class. We do try to order enough for everyone in a class. However, sometimes items do sell out prior to your class. Please review your class supply list and bring all the requested items, plus basic sewing items for quilting classes.

YARN BRANCH CLASS LEVELS

BEGINNER I - You have not yet learned or are not yet comfortable with knitting or crocheting. These classes will provide you with the basic skills needed.

BEGINNER II - You know how to cast-on, bind-off, knit, purl, increase, decrease, and follow a pattern. These classes will expand your skills or give you special tips.

INTERMEDIATE - You have many projects 'under your belt.' These classes are a little faster paced and often tackle more difficult patterns.

TONI'S KNIT FINISHING CLASS - SUNDAY

Toni McDermott All Levels \$35.00

Sunday - January 27, February 3 & 10

12:30pm - 2:30pm

Finishing class is an opportunity to make progress on any projects of participating members. Techniques are taught and discussed in the context of the projects. There is a lot of sharing, a few laughs, and a satisfaction of working with other knitters to accomplish finished projects. Come meet new friends and enjoy a pleasant two hours of knitting.

WHITMAN HAT

Toni McDermott Intermediate \$40.00

Tuesday - January 29, February 5, 12 & 19

6:00pm - 8:00pm

This beautiful hat is an adventure in advanced brioche knitting. Prerequisites are that the knitter is successful in using "bark" and "burp" stitches and can work brioche ribbing in the round. New techniques taught in the class will be how to read brioche chart symbols and how to work directional increases and decreases in brioche. The project uses two contrasting colors of fingering weight yarn. The class goal is to help brioche knitters progress from simple brioche to

advanced patterns which feature shaping and directional knitting.

KNITTING ESSENTIALS

Tamara Benton All Levels \$40.00

10:30am - 12:30pm

Whether you have never touched knitting needles or just need a refresher, this class is guaranteed to advance your knitting skills. Classes will be a combination of actual knitting and lecture/discussion. Discussion topics will include criteria for selecting yarn; reading yarn labels; choosing appropriate needles; knitting with and without patterns; and reviewing terms and abbreviations. Skill levels will determine the knitting segment of the class, ranging from how to begin; ways to hold yarn; how to control tension; or how to evaluate and improve your current project. Links to legitimate Internet resources will be suggested. Beginners should bring 9" No. 8 straight wooden needles and light colored, worsted weight yarn. If you have knitting experience, bring your project.

WINTERY MIX COWL

Janet Hepplewhite Beginner II \$25.00

Wednesday - February 6 & 13

6:00pm - 8:00pm

This gently shaped cowl is knit using a soft and drapery yarn. The lace pattern is both written and charted. The cowl increases in size through the use of different needle sizes. This is the perfect cowl for the wintery days ahead.

GARTER EARFLAP HAT

Sally Bennett Beginner II \$35.00

Monday - February 18, 25 & March 4

6:00pm - 8:00pm

This cute little hat is quick to work up and the short row ear flaps keep the ears nice and cozy. The pattern is sized from baby to adult, so you can knit one for everyone in the family. This is a great hat to show off a fun yarn and you only need one skein so treat yourself!

ALICE SWEATER

Toni McDermott Beginner II \$40.00
Wednesday - February 20, 27, March 13 & 27
6:00pm - 8:00pm

This sweater pattern is amazing. Alice is knit entirely in the round from top to bottom. The design is an example of top down sweater knitting at its best! The style is loose and flattering to a variety of wearers. All shaping is through the use of German short rows. This easy technique takes all the pain and guesswork out of short rowing. The store sample is knit out of Lavold's Silky Wool at a gauge of 6 stitches to the inch.

ANTLER TOQUE

Toni McDermott Beginner II \$35.00
Sunday - February 24, March 3 & 10
12:30pm - 2:30pm

The hat is a classic shape worked in worsted weight yarn. The design is unisex. Antler cables add interest. This hat is a great first project for knitters who know how to cast on, knit, and bind off but who don't have experience in using charts or in making cables. For more advanced knitters, the "cable without a cable needle" technique will be taught. Hat is worked in the round.

BABY SWEATER

TamaraBenton Beginner II \$40.00

The Basket Weave Baby Sweater by Carol Barenys is a free download from Ravelry. It's a traditional bottom-up pattern worked back and forth, and is best knit in a solid color to show off the textured stitch pattern. Appropriate for a boy or girl, button holes can be placed on both sides, then one side can later be sewn closed when buttons are added. Sleeves are worked in-the-round as stitches are picked up around the armholes, knit down, then bound off at the cuff. Only knit and purl stitches are used throughout

the pattern. This is a good sweater to have "on hand" for the next baby shower invitation.

TONI'S KNIT FINISHING CLASS - TUESDAY

Finishing class is an opportunity to make progress on any projects of participating members. Techniques are taught and discussed in the context of the projects. MINDFUL YOGA SOCKS

TamaraBenton Beginner II \$40.00
Thursday - March 14, 21 & 28

These socks are described by the designer, Diana McKay, as "the perfect project for peaceful knitting and quieting your thoughts," much like yoga itself. The pattern is a free download on Ravelry and instructions are given for worsted weight or sock weight yarn. Worked in k2p2 ribbing, without heels or toes, the socks are non-slip and are good in-the-round practice for those who would like to improve their circular knitting skills without having to work heels. The socks can be worked as presented in the pattern or can be "dressed up" with Tamara's lace-front variation, with beads, as displayed at Quilt Tree.

CAST ON AND BIND OFF WORKSHOP

TamaraBenton All Levels \$25.00

A cast on is the foundation of any knitting project and the bind off keeps the edge from unraveling, but there are many alternatives to Long Tail cast on and Standard bind off. This class will teach you how to choose an appropriate

cast on and bind off to enhance your work and will be a knit-along experience with samples to bring home. As usual, tips and techniques will be incorporated into the demonstrations and individual assistance will be given. All skill levels are welcome. We will cast on 10-12 sts, work an inch, then cast off. This is a good project to use small balls of light-colored worsted weight yarn from your stash.

FLAX SWEATER

Tuesday - April 2, 9, 16 & 30

6:00pm - 8:00pm

Whether you are new to sweater making, or looking to mix things up, the Flax sweater is the perfect fit! Sized from newborn to adult, you can make one for anyone in your life. If this is your first sweater, follow the pattern and learn basic sweater construction. For knitters looking to stretch their skills we can discuss how to personalize the sweater by adding pockets, stripes, or other colorwork.

FAIR ISLE MORGAN MITTS

Tamara Benton Intermediate \$40.00

Thursday - April 4, 11 & 18

6:00pm - 8:00pm

The Morgan Mitts pattern is shown on Ravelry but is a download from Knit Picks. Instructions are charted-only and worked in-the-round, so this is a great opportunity to sharpen your chart reading skills and to practice stranded knitting. Although the pattern calls for Knit Picks fingering yarn, any fingering yarn can be used and colors can be substituted. The pattern includes a few rows where three colors are utilized in one row. Though not considered Fair Isle, since Fair Isle knitting has only two colors per row, this stranded technique blends with the Fair Isle rows to add an additional dimension to these mitts. Needles for the project can be knitter's choice: magic loop, 2 circulars, dpn's or Flexi Flip.

BEGINNING SOCKS

Have you looked at a pair of socks and thought "I could never knit socks"? Now is the time for you to take the leap and learn to knit a basic sock. You will learn about the structure of socks and all the techniques you need to knit your very own socks...one step at a time. These socks will be top down and you will learn how to use the new Flexi Flip needles by Addi. These needles are fun and easy to knit with.
